Post-World War II Italy established itself internationally thanks to the happy combination of industrial design and the most famous names in architecture. Stilnovo was one of the first companies to transfer this combination to the lighting sector: since its foundation in 1946, it has never ceased to fascinate historians, collectors and design lovers.

Today, after the acquisition by Linea Light Group, Stilnovo aims to become a world leader for the home, hotel and restaurant, thanks to a legacy of light and contemporary lamps, presented in this catalog together with some re-editions of magnificent icons of the past, designed by the Masters of 20th century design.

Dating back to 1969, the Campana recalls the Pop style that is still trendy today. The new LED light source integrated into the large flared lampshade illuminates the underlying environment whilst creating a characteristic luminous corolla that slides across the external surface of the lamp.

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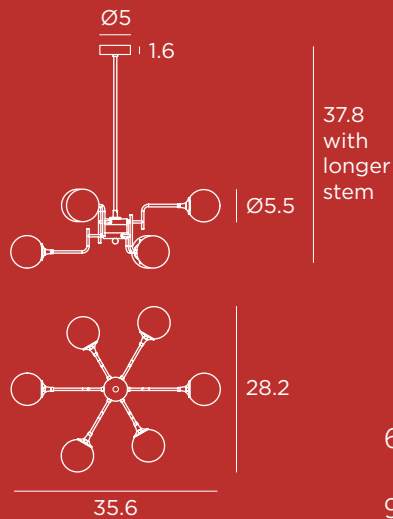
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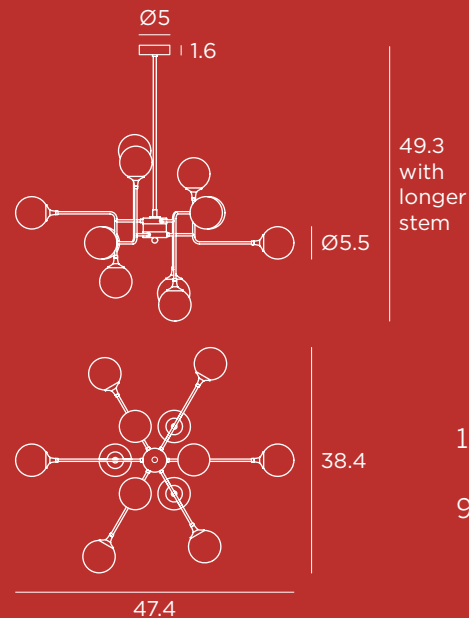
# Galassia suspension

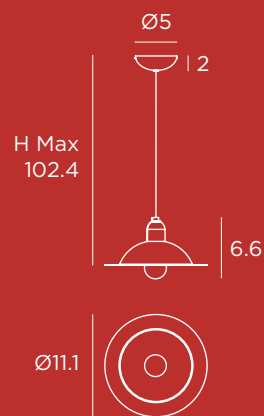

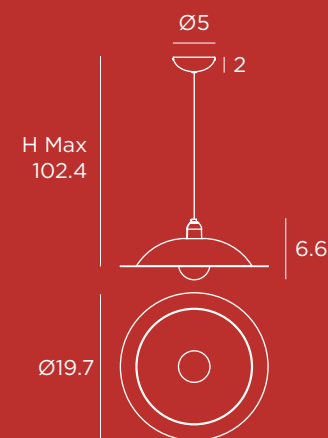

Since founding “Studio De Pas, D’Urbino, Lomazzi” in 1966, these three designers have made their mark mostly thanks to their non-conventional, pop-inspired style, recognizable in many of their interior design objects. They have collaborated with the most influential companies in the furniture sector and won the prestigious Premio Compasso d’Oro in 1979 with the Sciangai coat rack for Zanotta. Studio DDL production is documented in historical literature on Italian design and in the main international publications on architecture and industrial design. Many of their works are included in the permanent design collections of various museums throughout the world, and have been selected for traveling exhibitions on Italian design.

Their firm continued to work and still works even after the death of De Pas (1932-1991) on the design of architecture, objects, fit-outs, furniture, and in the urban planning sector.

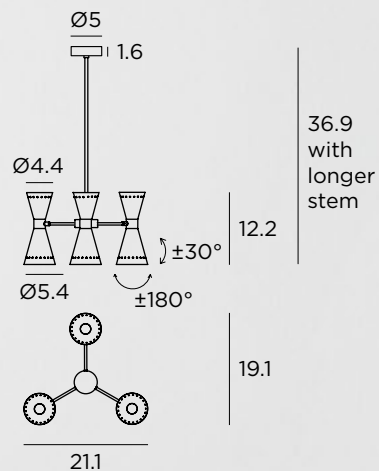
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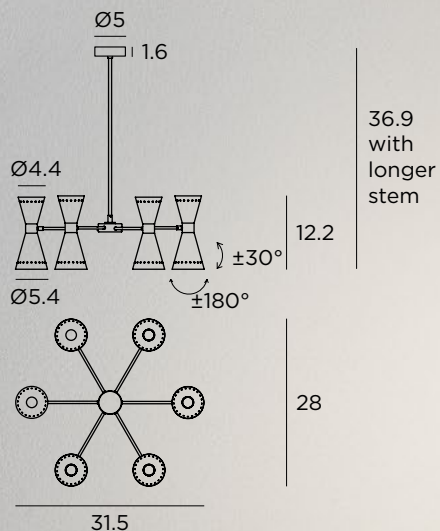
# Megafono suspension

Megafono is an iconic 1950s lamp with both direct and indirect light. In the suspension version with three, six or eight arms, a prized brass structure bearing galvanic gilding combines with the directable double-cone lampshades in ivory or glossy black, illuminating the environment with elegance.



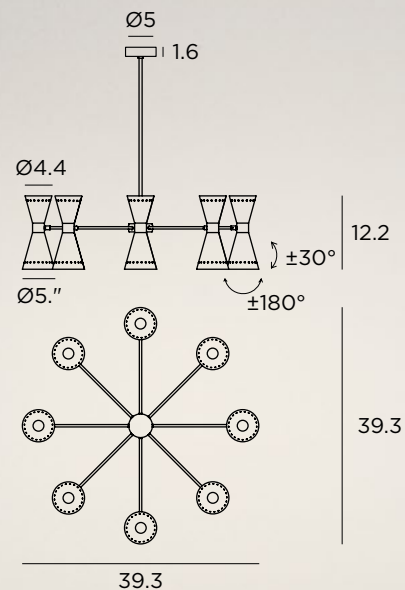

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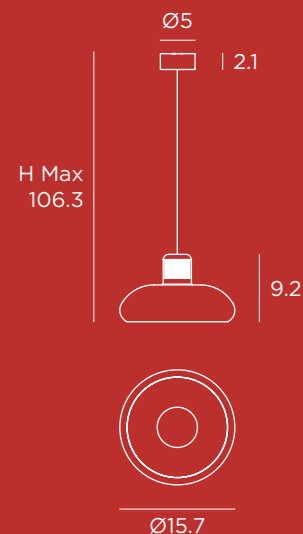
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# Trepiù

## **Gae Aulenti**

Gaetana Aulenti, born in Northern Italy in 1927, and moved to Milan at an early age to study Architecture at the renowned Milan Polytechnic University, where she defied tradition by being the only one of two women who graduated in her class.

As many of her peers, she started her career in the editorial world by working with the design magazine *Casabella*, immersed in the flourishing Milanese culture and in the Neoliberty movement, distancing herself from the Rationalism tendency of the war period.

## **Livio Castiglioni**

Livio Castiglioni was born in 1911 in Milan, where he graduated in architecture in 1936. He opened a firm with architect Luigi Caccia Dominioni, which his brothers Pier Giacomo and Achille would later join. Lights, sounds, and audiovisuals were his main interests.

## Minibox wall



The wall-mounted Minibox consists of a metal body and an irreverent luminous eye. The magnetic attachment of the head allows the light to be directed, rendering it suitable for any position.

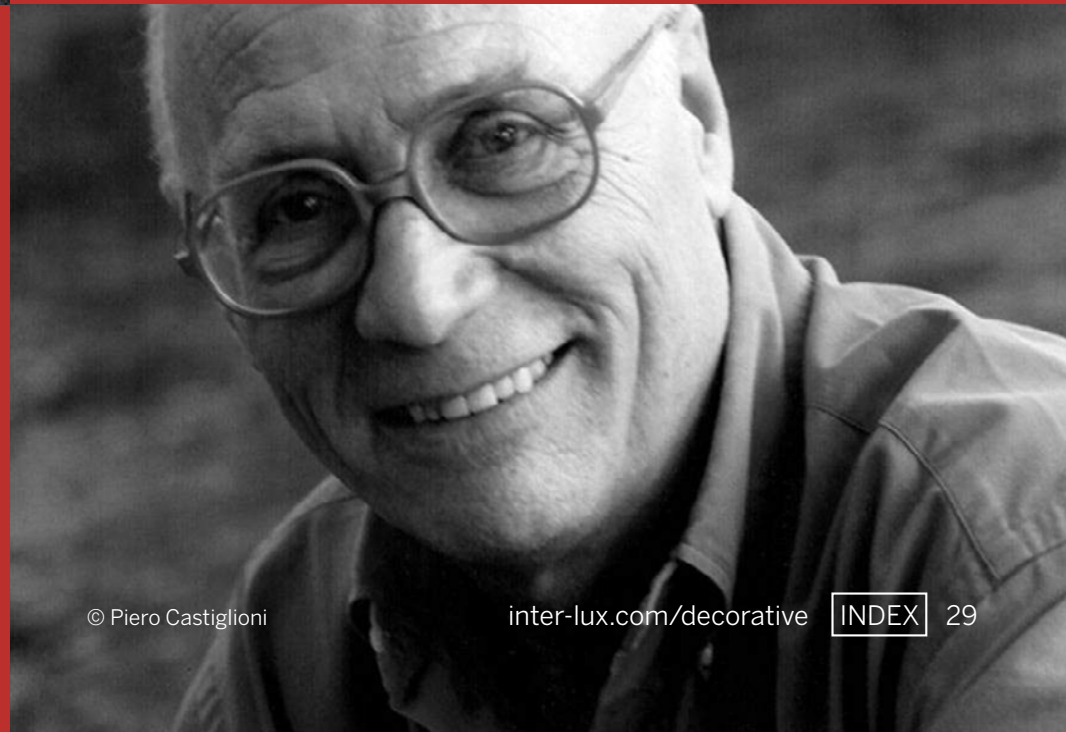

## Piero Castiglioni

Piero Castiglioni (b. 1944) is an Italian architect specialized in lighting design. Some of his most significant lighting projects include the Pompidou Centre and the Orsay Museum in Paris.
